Good Morning Mr. Brandt,

I am writing to follow up with my neighbor's construction project. I have not heard from you or Mr. Bozynski who came out 2/27/2018 when water was diverted onto our property creating a flooded situation. Since my last email to you, the contractor has performed additional excavation/filling work with which I have the following concerns.

- (1) Charter Township of Milford Code: **Sec. 32.574 Building grades.**
 - The original concern of runoff onto my property has not been resolved by the township and the contractor is continuing to backfill the property with fill from another location.
 - The code specifically says in paragraph (b) that a new building "shall be graded in such a manner as to meet existing grades and not to permit runoff surface water to flow onto the adjacent property".

- (1) Charter Township of Milford Code: **Sec. 32-583 Filling operations.**
 - The fill that contractor is currently dumping has foreign material, concrete, pipe, misc, which indicates it may have been sourced from an industrial site demo and therefore possibly contaminated. I would like to review the approval from the township and any test results confirming this fill will not contaminate the surrounding soil and ground water.
 - The code reads "It shall be unlawful for any person to use land for filling with materials of any kind without approval of the township board and subject to requirements as may be appropriate."

Is a resolution to this issue currently being addressed? My intention is not to impede the construction project but only to assure that the damage to my property is being addressed.

Please contact me for any questions or with any plans to remedy this problem.
